

From the Common - Kartvelian Vocabulary. III.

Summary

For the illustration of sound accordances of the Kartvelian languages and revealing of common-Kartvelian stems, not only the data of Literary Georgian but also those of the dialects of Georgian carry an enormous significance. The examples presented below have been selected based on this principle.
