### SIKO PASHALISHVILI'S PHILOSOPHICAL LYRICS

S. Pashalishvili has a certain number of poems with a strong philosophical emphasis and observation on life, and with the intention of finding the reason and purpose of human existence: Time and tide complicates the task of explaining the puzzles of life and excruciates his spiritual pains. Of particular importance in this respect are the poems: "Immortality", the Inscription in the Wilderness", "the Truth", "Minor Verdict" and more.

In these poems the author discussing the human destiny, suggests that the life course of every man should be examined and assessed and each person should be judged and repaid according the merits he deserves. The author also develops an idea that the most important aspirations a man should seek after in his life are altruism and loyalty.

S. Pashalishvili's philosophical lyrics has many facets. The author renders impressive artistic picture of problems of harmonious merging of good and evil, life and death, and of creatures of nature.
