SOCIALIST-FEDERALIST PARTY DURING THE SOVIET PERIOD

In the initial years of establishing the Soviet power in Georgia national political parties appeared under severe conditions.

In 1921 in the situation when even the Communist party could not convene the party assembly, Socialist-federalists managed to do it.

In June 5, 1921 the party held a conference which was a great event in the life of the illegal political parties Georgia. Tedo Glonti led the leftist wing of the party. During this period the party issued newspapers "Socialist-federalist" and "Tribuna". In the early 20s of Georgia's life these newspapers were the only means to express social and political thought formally. In 1922 the party established "Committee of Independence". Grigol Rtskhiladze and Samson Dadiani were the active members of the committee. The organizers of the 1924 rebellion had contacts with the Georgian Government in emigration to get professional instructions. The Soviet government smothered the rebellion in blood.

From the earliest days of its formation to its liquidation Socialist-federalist party fought for the autonomy of Georgia and then for its complete independence. The party had played the great role in the formation of national spirit.
