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VENTURES IN THE GEORGIAN FOLK TALES

Having been duped multiple times trustful personages cannot learn lessons and being exited to exact revenge on the enemy fail to see the next misfortune cast over them until they experience its bitterness one more times.

Folk tale personages always reveal their character, mood and are in a hurry to meet each other, mostly fighting against one another or act against each other. Their relationship is built on the venture activities.
