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ON FORMATION OF ACTIVE PARTICIPLE OF FORM I IN LITERARY ARABIC AND EGYPTIAN DIALECT

Formation of active participle of Form I is diverse on the one hand, in literary Arabic, and on the other hand, in dialects. Under this aspect, the Egyptian dialect is interesting due to the attested forms that more or less differ from the literary Arabic.

The article provides a thorough analysis of patterns of active participle derived from various types of verbs (trilateral regular sound verbs, hamzated, weak, geminate verbs). Phonetic variants of certain patterns are discussed.
