### **KARTVELIAN SPEECH CODES WITHIN THE GLOBALIZATION CONTEXT AND ASPECTS OF SYNCHRONIC DESCRIPTION.**

Dialect speech zones have always been (and still represent) an adequate sign of an overall situation in a language. We encounter the influence of the globalization process on the Kartvelian speech codes (sub-systems) on the basis of which the following is evident: a decreased number of speakers of these speech codes, a change in an inner speech situation through various linguistic or non-linguistic factors. Along with the Kartvelian speech codes the mixed speech codes of the immigrants were formed long time ago. The immigranti speech is not an isolated phenomenon; the speech codes of immigrants are reflected in the speech with those engaged in contact.

Each linguistic areal involving migration processes requires constant synchronic description in order to timely document changes in codes. In certain cases these changes are progressive (the Georgian speech code is strengthened), while in other cases regressive phenomena occur. In order to predict the future situation, it is equally necessary to explore and analyze both aspects.
