

**SULKHAN KUPRASHVILI, RADA SADILOVA**  
**RECORDS CONCERNING**  
**GIORGI ZDANOVICH (MAIASHVILI)**  
**IN FOREIGN ARCHIVAL MATERIALS AND PERIODICALS**

Giorgi Zdanovich (Maiashvili; patronymic form: Felix), a public figure of Polish origin was one of the important and prominent representatives of the Georgian Intelligentsia of the second half of the 19th century.

The research carried out concerning the life and work of Giorgi Zdanovich in the Georgian language is quite limited. The foreign archival documents that have not been published so far are priceless for the study of his life and his revolutionary and public endeavours. Equally interesting are materials in magazines and newspapers as well as in various monographic works that are preserved in archives and public libraries of Petersburg, Moscow, Vilnius, Tomsk and other countries of the former Soviet Union.

Especially significant data is preserved in the archives and libraries of Moscow and Leningrad. The archival materials reflect revolutionary activities of Giorgi Zdanovich, while his articles published in the Russian press represent excellent examples of Georgian political thought.
